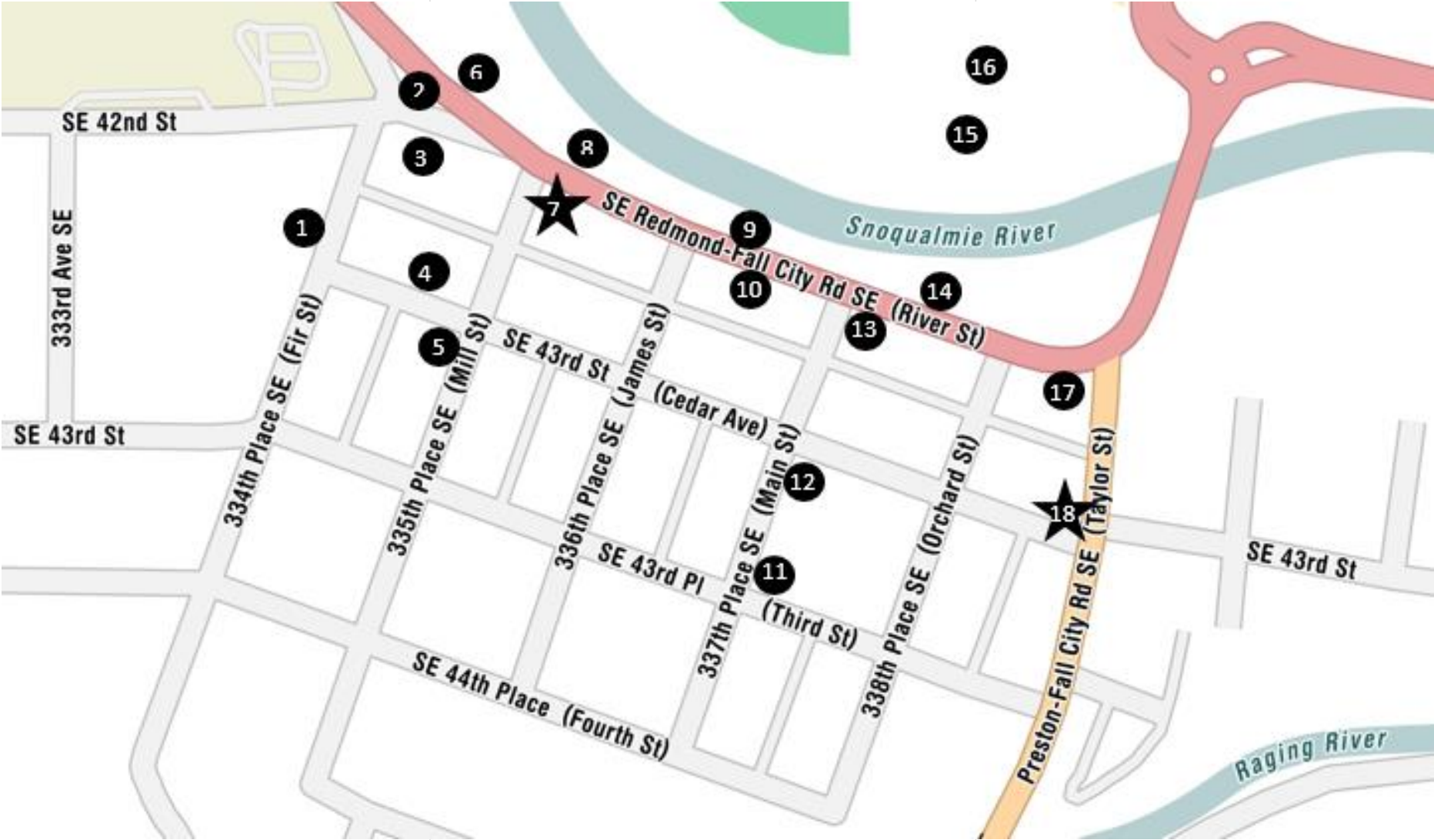
Guide to



- 1. King County Fire Department** *Built 1977*
Originally, there were 27 volunteer firefighters here. Now, there are 6 full time firefighters and 11 volunteers.
- 2. Rusted Fish Zombies** *Installed 2005*
Actually titled "Upstream/Precious Moments", this piece was made by artist Victor White in memory of June Starkey.
- 3. The Greater Good** *Installed 2008*
Located outside of the Fall City Public Library, this piece was made by artist June Sekiguchi.
- 4. Fall City Post Office** *Built 1986*
Built by Joseph DePalma and leased to the US Postal Service. Craig Taylor was the first Postmaster for this building.
- 5. Eagle's Eyrie**
An eagle nest! Be careful around non-pokemon wildlife – these birds can't be caught, per US law.
- 6. Tall Totem** *Installed 1934*
Carved by H. H. Hinds out of a cedar log, this totem pole was dedicated to the memory of Julia Harshman. From 1982 until 2001 it was replaced by a smaller totem, due to aging damage. It was restored by Boy Scout Troop 425 from 1999 to 2001, when the totem was reinstalled.
- 7. GYM – Trikonsana Sculpture** *Installed 2009*
Located inside Fall City's Art Park, this sculpture was made by artist Shawn Kelley.
- 8. Fall City Waterfront**
This historical plaque details the history of Fall City, which was the first town settled in the Snoqualmie Valley.
- 9. Charles V. Hanson Memorial** *Installed 1969*
Built as a community tribute to Charles Hanson, who worked as a rural mail carrier and helped to organize many civic projects.
- 10. Sidewalk Fish** *Installed*
Small fish are painted on the sidewalk here, representing the salmon that spawn in the river.
- 11. Fall City Methodist Church** *Built 1899*
Originally built as a Baptist Church, this building was purchased by the Methodist Church in 1919 and rolled across the street on logs in 1929 to the current site!
- 12. FC Masonic Lodge** *Built 1895*
Built by Falls City Lodge #66, this building has long been used for community events.
- 13. River Sphere** *Installed 2008*
Created by artist Steve Sandry out of a boulder taken from the Serpentine River.
- 14. Raging River Riders Bench**
Fall City's Saddle Club, the Raging River Riders, can always be distinguished by their colors of turquoise, black and a trim of yellow-gold.
- 15. Fall City Hopshed** *Built 1880*
This King Country Landmark is the last remaining structure from the Hop Industry in the Snoqualmie Valley. This shed was used to dry the hops before shipping.
- 16. Fall City Park Habitat Restoration Project**
A levee built in the 1930s to restore the bank of the Snoqualmie River has, over time, eroded the river. This project aims to restore the salmon habitat.
- 17. Horse and Anchor** *Built 1930*
This building is actually the Last Frontier Saloon, which was built by Lars Johanson as a short order restaurant.
- 18. GYM - Small Fries** *Built 1981*
Built by Darrel Thompson, this is a popular burger and shake joint.
