side of the center line. As very little grading will be re-

This road is in part a relocation of Road #234 for the purpose of lessening the grade between Falls City & the Falls City Depot, over which road practically all the traffic of this portion of the Monongahela Valley passes. The grade on the present traveled road is in what part about 3% come of it as heavy as to make freight transportation between Falls City & steel Depots very much more expensive than a specific lighter grade would necessitate. For this reason we think the road a necessity. One bridge about 100 ft long & averaging 20 ft in height will be needed. The first time will be taken off the road on the plan of A. Marshall.



This Indenture made this Seventh^{day} of January 1807 between
A. Marshall and wife, parties of the first part, and the County of King,

WITNESSETH : That Whereas certain proceedings were instituted by
the Board of County Commissioners of King county Washington in the
year 1806, for the location of a public road across the land owned
by the party of the first part in the North east 1/4 of section 22,
township 24, north 7 east N.W. in King county Washington, and
subsequently such proceedings were had in the matter of the said road
that a roadway was surveyed and laid off and proceedings were had
by the County Commissioners for the purpose of establishing the same
as a public road ~~being~~ ^{the} number 234. And Whereas, doubt exists as
to the validity of the establishment of said road as laid out and
opened and now used, said road being known as the Fall City road, and
for the purpose of removing all doubt as to the legality of the estab-
lishment of said road and for the purpose of dedicating the same as
laid out and traveled to the public for a public road and in consider-
ation of the payment of the sum of One hundred dollars (\$100.00) by the party of the second




