Isackson Sawmill Tour

Duane Isackson, whose father Henry Isackson founded the mill in 1936, will talk about its history and give a demonstration. Folks who attended the tour in 2009 found it fascinating.

There is parking available, but carpooling from Fall City would be a good idea. Drive toward Redmond on Highway 202 approximately 12 miles, to the traffic light by the gas station at NE 244th. Turn left on 244th, and the sawmill is visible from the road on the right side, just a little way down.
