

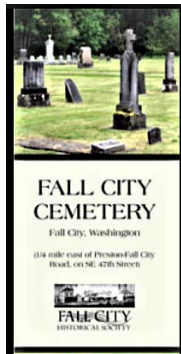

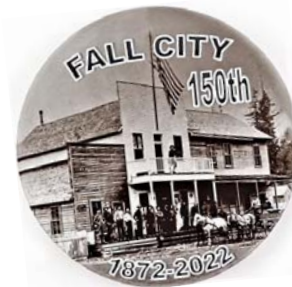

The Photo on the 150th Button

In about 1886, David “Doc” Taylor built a store (with dancehall above) on River Street... the first large building in Fall City, platted in 1887. He soon added a small restaurant (on left) and a two-story building on the right which served both as the Taylor home and an informal hotel for the area for several years.
