



Honoring All Who Have Served & Who Are Serving

Although the origins of Veterans Day lie with the end of WWI, it is a day to remember and honor veterans from all wars, conflicts and peacetime service, including those who are actively serving today. Fall City is home to many veterans, including fourteen who served in the Civil War. During the years of WWI and WWII, many Fall City and area residents answered the call of duty, some making the ultimate sacrifice. Reading through their names, one cannot miss the deep impact to the families and to the community as brothers, fathers, sons, and cousins served together. For some families, multiple generations have served as world events evolved in to the Korean War, Vietnam Conflict, and more recently the Gulf War, and Wars in Iraq & Afghanistan.

Here in the Valley, there are multiple locations dedicated to veterans, including the Snoqualmie Valley Veterans Memorial in Snoqualmie, the Veterans Memorial Garden in North Bend, and the Veteran Memorial in Fall City Cemetery.
